Mayor Vini Samuel presiding.

Mayor Samuel called the meeting of September 11, 2018 to order at 7:00 p.m.

FLAG CEREMONY: Pledge of Allegiance

ROLL CALL: Councilman Wood, Councilwoman Cristobal, Councilman Hatley, Councilman Trimble, Councilman Cope, and Councilman Skaramuca were all present. Councilman Bryson was present via conference call.

STAFF PRESENT: CFO/City Clerk Streeter, Police Chief Vance, Fire Chief Rux, Public Works Director Olden, Forester Hiner, City Attorney Coker and Deputy Clerk Lillegard were present.

APPROVAL OF BILLS: Councilman Trimble presented the bills in the amount of \$83,361.38 for checks #53280-#53312. Councilman Trimble made a motion to approve the bills as audited which was seconded by Councilman Hatley.

Motion passed 7-0.

PAYROLL: Checks #40584to #40615 in the amount of \$190,420.64.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES: A motion to approve the minutes of the August 28, 2018 council meeting was made by Councilman Cope with a second by Councilman Wood. There were no corrections or additions. Motion passed 7-0.

COMMITTEE REPORTS/FOR COUNCIL INTRODUCTION

Public Works Committee

Councilman Skaramuca reported the PW Committee met on September 5th with PW Director Olden, CFO/City Clerk Streeter, Councilwoman Cristobal, and Councilman Hatley all present. They discussed the following: FEMA has released the newest version of the flood plain map for Montesano; they discussed projects for the 2019 budget which included several street improvements; discussed a possible way of funding streets might creating a transportation district which would allow the city to possibly levy for dollars some way to create a revenue source; reported on the status of the property abatement which had gone to court on September 10, 2018; Attorney Coker updated on what exactly the Order of Default and Order of Abatement meant.

FORESTRY

Councilman Cope reported the Forestry Committee will be meeting soon.

FLOOD AUTHORITY

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Councilman Wood reported the Flood Authority meets on September 20th at City Hall where they will be discussing among other things, the small works projects of which we have one and what package will be taken to the legislature.

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COUNCIL INTRODUCTION

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Councilmen Wood made a presentation regarding his concern about a noxious weed called Knotweed (Japanese, Giant or Himalayan). Councilman Wood provided photographs of areas around town where it can be found and more detailed information regarding this particular weed; updated the council on the Noxious Weed Control Boards view of this weed and provided a sample of the weed and its roots. Councilman Wood expressed concern over major drainage issues related to this weed and it spreading. Councilman Wood agreed this should go to the Public Works Committee for further consideration as to an approach to this problem.

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NEW BUSINESS:

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PETITION FOR ANNEXATION-Introduction

Mayor Samuel advised the council the city had received a petition for annexation and the paperwork including a map of the proposed area was in their packet for consideration; Mayor Samuel advised 60% of the property value within the annexation area has to be in favor for this to go through. At this time, she is asking the council to consider this request with action being taken at the next meeting. The steps for annexation were discussed with comments added by CFO Streeter and Public Works Director Olden. Some discussion and a few questions followed.

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ORDINANCES & RESOLUTIONS

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Resolution #944 authorizing the adoption of the Grays Harbor County Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard **Mitigation Plan:**

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Councilman Wood made a motion to approve but not release this resolution until some changes were made to the Hazard History Table concerning the 1999 earthquake. This event was left off of the documentation which was used to form the hazard mitigation plan and this was a significant event in the history of Montesano. Councilman Hatley made a second to the motion. More discussion ensued and input from Fire Chief Rux was given.

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Motion passed 7-0

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Resolution adopting a policy protecting individuals engaged in nonviolent civil rights demonstrationdiscussion

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This is set for action at the next meeting. There were no questions or comments.

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Resolution adopting a residential anti-displacement and relocation assistance plan-discussion

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Councilman Wood had questions and concerns regarding some of the language; he wants language that protects the city from being responsible for someone else's action. This is set for action at the next meeting.

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PUBLIC COMMENT- None

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COUNCIL COMMENTS

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Councilman Wood thanked everyone who worked on getting the abatement finished; acknowledged today was 9/11 and the impact this date has on all of us; thanked the council for humoring him with his crusade on noxious weeds.

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Councilman Hatley also thanked the people responsible for the hard work on the abatement; recognized it was 9/11, hoping we remember and never forget; recognized we have a noxious weed problem that will need to be addressed.

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Councilwoman Cristobal thanked Mike Olden for all his hard working in seeking grant funding for our roads.

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Councilman Trimble-none

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Councilman Cope echoed everyone else's thank you for the work on the abatement; thanked Councilman Wood for bringing the knotweed issue forward; looking forward to more conversation with the hospital board.

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Councilman Bryson thanked the Mayor and council for putting up with his absence and having to conference call in.

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Councilman Skaramuca echoed everything said by other members regarding 9/11 pointing out the reports show the health related deaths has almost caught up with those killed on that day; thanked everyone for their work on the abatement.

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MAYOR'S COMMENTS

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Mayor Samuel echoed all that had been said reference today being 9/11; thanked Mike Olden for extending projects especially the little leg of Marcy Avenue between Chehalis and Church. She appreciates his ability to think on his feet and get things done. Mayor Samuel advised she met with three members of hospital board plus labor folks and Mr. Jensen. A public disclosure request has been made so we can know the correct dollar amounts involved; reminded everyone tomorrow was open house for the school district, the football season has started and Saturday is the 9th annual Lake Sylvia Festival.
