News you may not have heard:

Sound Urban Forestry was contracted to perform sonic tests (sound waves) to determine the health of the Fleet Park Sequoia tree, which had been identified as having a problem. This assessment was done on August 17th and the report was made available at the August 28th Council meeting. The Council will make its decision and it will be announced in *The Vidette* and also here next month.

Their summer schedule is over and the Council returns to the regular 2nd and 4th Tuesdays for meetings. The public is always welcome!

Public Works Activities:

Hopefully by the time you are reading this report the Church Street 2012 project will be complete. As most of you know we have few funds to do major street repair. However, through careful budgeting, we were able to come up with enough funds to replace sidewalks, curbing, aging underground pipes and resurface between Spruce & Broadway. Until we can create a revenue source, our efforts are limited for doing major street work. Meantime we will work with our personnel and those limited funds to do small projects.
