No more train tracks—The train tracks (and giant pothole) at the east-bound exit to downtown are now gone. DOT removed the tracks and paved over the

spot. Not only does this end an annoyance, the lack of tracks will improve safety and let motorists make a clean left or right without being distracted by the rails. A big thanks to the



Department of Transportation and local lawmakers for working together to get this done.

Demonstration street— We're embarking on finding ways to address streets that need work even when we don't have a large sum of money to make reconstruction happen.

Spruce Street is narrow and riddled with cracks. Public Works/Community Development Director Mike Olden, a civil engineer, used his skills and creativity to tackle this on-going problem. Usually, a 50-foot section like this replaced with asphalt would normally cost upwards of \$75,000. Using the city Public Works crew and concrete, we will replace and widen the same section for under \$10,000.

This is an exciting effort and I applaud the creativity and hard work from Mike and the public works department who've done a great job replacing sidewalks downtown this summer. Hats off to them.
