June: Celebrating 75 Years of Sustainable Forestry

Seventy-five years ago, the American Tree Farm System established the first ever certified tree farm in North America on the Clemons Tree Farm in Montesano. Today, there are more than 900 tree farms in Washington state and 80,000 family owned tree farms in America. A coalition of forestry partners has organized the celebration of this significant milestone .

On June 17, the Washington Farm Forestry Association will hold its annual meeting. On June 18, there'll be a public event to celebrate this anniversary. The celebration will be held at the High School starting at 10 a.m.

This public event will highlight the integrated nature of what it is to be a tree farmer – starting with a compelling story of a multi-generational tree farmer (our very own **Bill Stewart**, son of Vera and James Stewart) and ending with a story of how the seedling we plant will ultimately be used in tall wood buildings that will grace our cities in the future.

Elected officials and agency leaders will talk about the significance of small forest landowners as a critical part of our rural economy, environment, and social fabric. The American Tree Farm System National office will offer a wider perspective on the importance of looking forward while building on where we have come from over the past 75 years. We close with a ceremony honoring tree farmers who epitomize what it is to be *Stewards of the Land* and then head out for some interesting forester led guided tours of the local tree farm.
